Bylaw Amendments Fall 2020

Proposed amendments to the AAA bylaws fall into the following categories

- 1. Housekeeping simple, largely administrative items that we want to address while we have an opportunity
- 2. Nominations simplification of the two-tier process
- 3. Council election procedures an update to reflect current practices
- 4. Governance structural governance matters
- 5. Membership elimination of a use of a post nominal
- 6. Professional Liability Insurance adding the requirement for insurance

HOUSEKEEPING

In the document minor changes are suggested to tidy up elements for more efficient and effective administration. These items do not reflect any significant change in policies.

Past president breaking a tie vote	Edit role of scrutineers to include "Any" Past President who remains a voting member.	The current bylaws suggest only the most recent Past President shall cast a vote to break the tie. However, the requirement for scrutineers does not mandate that the most recent Past President be included in the contingent of scrutineers. It is more efficient if the reference is changed to "any" past president. It is possible that the most recent Past President is serving as a scrutineer but would not absolutely have to be this person. If the most recent Past President is not immediately available, then there could be a significant problem. Better to simplify this to Any past president. Further, if the role of Past President is to be eliminated as one of the governance changes, then there will be no Immediate Past President available.	3.11

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GOVERNANCE

In 2019 a Governance Model Renewal Task Force was established by the Council to make recommendations about the future governance model practices, structures and processes of the AAA.

The goal was to ensure that leading governance practices were incorporated into the AAA to support Council in its desire to become a strategy-focused, high performance governing body.

There is a desire to adopt a new committee model that supports the redefined role and responsibilities of Council.

It was recommended that a change in the bylaws be made to create an officer and committee chair structure that ensures all positions support the work of Council and allow for succession planning.

Further, there should be an alignment of Council's size and composition to ensure that Council can perform its strategic and regulatory roles and functions.

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PROFESSIONAL LIABILITY INSURANCE

Adding a requirement for professional liability insurance in the bylaws is in keeping with the vote on guiding principles for legislation by AAA members in 2014 for liability insurance to be a requirement for all authorized entities. At that time, the members voted overwhelmingly in favor of making insurance mandatory for firms actively practicing architecture.

It is the intent to embed this requirement in updated legislation, however we do not have a timeline for updates to the *Architects Act* or General Regulation.

Professional Liability Insurance	Add requirement for firms to carry professional liability insurance. Authorize Council to specify the amounts and process. Intent is for the requirement to be coverage of a minimum of \$250,000 per claim with \$500,000 aggregate.	Although it is an unwritten expectation and a demand of most major clients that firms regulated by the AAA carry professional liability insurance, the AAA Council is aware that some of our member firms do not carry such insurance. In the view of the AAA Council this is an unacceptable risk to the public. Alberta is the only remaining province that does not require that its member firms carry liability insurance.
